

STAY SAFE



WITH TRADESPEOPLE IN YOUR HOME



A tradesperson should contact you in advance of their arrival to advise how they plan to work safely



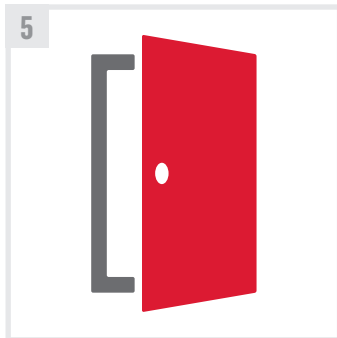
If anyone in the household is self-isolating or has symptoms, no work should be carried out



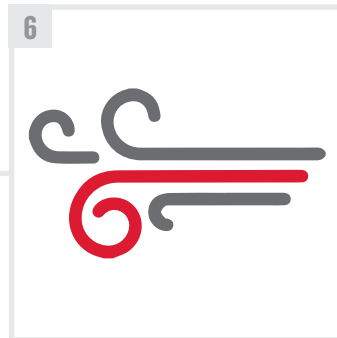
Upon arrival, stand back when you open the door and do not shake hands



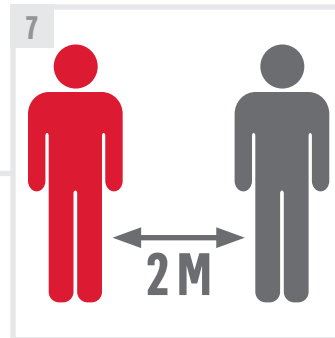
Allow the tradesperson to wash their hands for 20 seconds using soap and warm water before starting work



Leave all internal doors open to minimise contact with door handles



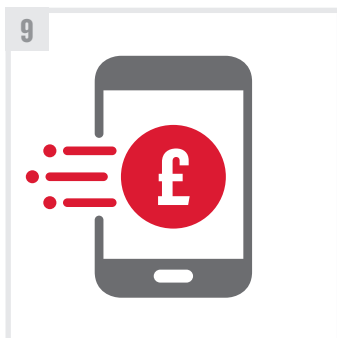
Ventilate the work area well – if possible open a window



Maintain a safe distance of at least 2 metres from any tradesperson at all times



While the work is carried out, stay in a separate room, no need to provide drinks



On completion of the work, use bank transfers rather than cash



If someone in the household is extremely vulnerable or has coronavirus symptoms but emergency work needs to be carried out:

- Stay in a separate room while the work is carried out
- If this is not possible, stay as far away from the tradesperson as possible
- Clean all surfaces you have been in contact with and advise the customer which surfaces you have touched

No work should be carried out by a tradesperson who has coronavirus symptoms, however mild or where someone in the household has symptoms
